SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

This past month was much quieter on the course with only one outing and the various warm season turf areas finally coming to a halt. Most areas held color well into November. Our first official frost was October 30th. We followed up the next week with two mornings approaching the freezing mark. The fall color change and subsequent leaf drop was a good 2-3 weeks behind and we still had some hardwoods holding leaves at Thanksgiving.

Fall pre-emerge applications were completed last month in-house. The first color procedures on both tees and greens were to be completed in late November or early December. 2006 greens procedures were almost 3 weeks later than the last year.

The practice tee opened back up on November 12th and the par 3 tees the following Monday. Both areas germinated well and we are back to our normal winter height of cut.

This winter we will be busy with limbing many of our fairway tree lines and also continuing to remove roots that border rough and natural areas. We will also be clearing the area to the right of the club exit to give a better view of the new clubhouse.

The Grounds Department would like to welcome Mr. Bert Morales, our new Director of Operations, to West Lake. We look forward to the season ahead and working with Mr. Morales as we move toward 2008.

We as a department would also like to wish the very best to David McManus as he retires from the General Manager's position. He has been a strong supporter for our department and has seen West Lake through an important stage in its history. The renovation complete, he has earned some leisure time. Good luck with your tennis & golf!

REMINDER NOTICE

16. Food and Beverage Service: The following is taken from the Columbia County Code: **Sec. 2-3-37. Bringing beverages into establishments prohibited.** No person shall bring his/her own alcoholic beverages into any commercial establishment regardless of whether such establishment is operated pursuant to a license.

All beverages, including beer and wine, must be purchased from the Club. No member shall serve any beer, wine, or other beverage which was not purchased from the Club. Any exceptions must be cleared with management well in advance and a predetermined corkage fee will be charged.

West Lake is licensed to dispense alcoholic beverages and the Club will comply with all federal, state and local laws pertaining to the sale and service of alcoholic beverages. It is against the law to serve alcoholic beverages to minors.

There will be no food or beverages brought into the Club with the exception of specialty items approved by management.

Tripp's Tips:

Turfgrass: Warm season turfgrasses such as Bermuda, Zoysia, and Centipede will be going dormant soon. Due to the cold weather and lack of precipitation warm season turfgrasses may need to be watered. One half inch of water per week will be sufficient. If you have over seeded your lawn you need to apply one inch of water per week. Remember keep removing tree leaves or debris from the turf area to insure germination of seed. If leaves are left unsightly bare spots will occur. When the lawn becomes established, water only when necessary to prevent the ryegrass from wilting. Fertilize ryegrass after the second mowing. Use a complete fertilizer such as 16-4-8. Fertilize with 1 pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet. Delay planting warm season grasses until the air temperature stays consistently above 60 degrees. Do not fertilize dormant lawns. Maintain ryegrass lawns at a height of one inch. Dormant lawns don't need mowing but make sure your mower will start. Service your mower yourself or take it to a local repair shop.

Annuals and Bedding Plants: Allow perennials to go dormant so they can tolerate the winter weather. Good rule of thumb, if the perennial looks dormant give it another week before cutting it back. If you have not added mulch to perennials now is the time to do so. Mulch at a 2-inch depth. This will help conserve soil moisture and protect the root system from the winter weather. Keep new plantings as well as established gardens watered if the weather is sunny and windy. They tend to dry out quickly in this type of weather. Also, clean up the dead leaves from around perennials. If left on the ground, leaves can harbor disease and provide insects a place to overwinter. Your pansies, violas, kale, and ornamental cabbage should be in the ground. Remember annuals should be planted allowing at least six weeks before the first expected freeze to help them get established. Keep an eye on the water needs of annuals. Check the soil for moisture; don't wait until the plants show wilting to start watering. Use a complete fertilizer such as 10-10-10 if the plants have begun to grow. This will encourage establishment and flowering.

Trees and Shrubs: Don't let cooler temperatures deceive you. Continue to water on a regular basis. Prune any branches that are dead, diseased, or broken. Keep a watchful eye out for spider mites, whiteflies, and bag worms. Apply insecticides such as Sevin, Dursban, or Orthene to prevent damage from aphids and spider mites. Inspect Arborvitae and Juniper for small cone-shaped bags. They resemble a hornets nest but much smaller. The nests are about the size of a half dollar. The only control is to inspect and remove all the bags you find. If there is any evidence of Scale on shrubs, spray with Dormant Oil in late fall and again in early spring. Do not fertilize trees or shrubs. December 15th is the cut off date for new plantings. Both trees and shrubs can be planted up to this date. Remember to make the planting hole only as deep as the rootball but, make it at least two to three times the diameter of the rootball. Don't be too hasty to fertilize your trees or shrubs. Wait until budbreak when the new growth emerges in the spring.

HANDICAP COMMITTEE TIPS OF THE MONTH

Source: 2006-2007 USGA Handicap System Book

Q. How many holes need to be played in order for a score to be posted?

A. An 18 hole score should be posted if 13 or more holes are played. A 9 hole score should be posted if 7 to 12 holes are played.

In either case, scores for un-played holes must be recorded as par *plus* any handicap strokes that the player is entitled to receive on the un-played holes. Example: A player with a course handicap of 30 stops playing after 16 holes because of darkness. Hole 17 is par 3 and is the number 18 handicap stroke hole. The player will record 3 plus 1 handicap stroke for a total of 4 on hole 17. Hole 18 is a par 4 and is the number 12 handicap stroke hole. The player will record 4 plus 2 handicap strokes for a total of 6 on hole 18.

Q. Should scores be posted in team competitions in which both players do not always complete each hole?

A. Yes players should post scores from team competitions. Players should record the score that they would have "most likely" made on each unfinished hole, not to exceed that player's maximum score under equitable stroke control. "Most Likely" score is a judgment that each player must make based on his or her own game. It consists of the number of strokes already taken plus, in the players best judgment, the number of strokes needed to complete the hole from that position more than half of the time.

Q. What is equitable stroke control?

A. "Equitable Stroke Control" (ESC) is the downward adjustment of individual hole scores for handicap purposes in order to make handicaps more representative of a player's potential ability. ESC sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole depending on the player's *Course Handicap*. ESC is used only when a player's actual or *most likely score* exceeds the player's maximum number based on the table at right.
